

COOS BAY SCHOOL DISTRICT MODEL HEALTHY AND SAFE SCHOOLS PLAN

Each school district, education service district, and public charter school must develop a Healthy and Safe Schools Plan for all buildings owned or leased by the school district or public charter school where students and staff are present on a regular basis.

A school district, education service district, or public charter school may adopt any plan that complies with the requirements of OAR 581-022-2223.

1. Responsible Person

OAR 581-022-2223(5)(a) states that the Healthy and Safe Schools Plan must include the position within the school district's or public charter school's administration responsible for maintaining and implementing the Healthy and Safe Schools Plan.

2. List of Buildings

OAR 581-022-2223(5)(b) states that the Healthy and Safe Schools Plan must include a list of all facilities that are included in the Healthy and Safe Schools Plan.

3. Radon

OAR 581-022-2223(5)(c) states that the Healthy and Safe Schools Plan must include a plan to test for elevated levels of radon as required under ORS 332.167

The district has adopted a radon plan as required by ORS 332.167. Community members can access a copy of the radon plan here: The school District may contract testing services.

4. Lead in Drinking water

OAR 581-022-2223(5)(d) states that the Healthy and Safe Schools Plan will include a plan to test for and reduce exposure to lead in water used for drinking or food preparation. When the Coos Bay School District conducts lead testing of drinking water, an Oregon Health Authority accredited lab will be used for all testing.

The Coos Bay School District has recently tested for lead in drinking water and posted the results for the public. The Coos Bay School District will test every five years.

In developing a plan to test for and reduce exposure to lead in water used for drinking or food preparation, the following components are recommended by the Oregon Department of Education and the Oregon Health Authority:

1. **Identify sources of lead:** *The Coos Bay School District will test all taps used for drinking or food preparation in the building to identify any lead problems. Follow the Environmental Protection Agency's 3 T's Revised Technical Guidance to ensure that samples for lead are collected properly and from the right places. Use an OHA-accredited drinking water laboratory to analyze samples for lead.*
2. **Stop access:** *The Coos Bay School District will prevent access to water taps that have more than 20 parts per billion (ppb) of lead. This will include shutting off taps, covering water fountains, and providing bottled water to students and staff members.*
3. **Communicate:** *Make results from tests for lead in water available to students, families, and the community as quickly as possible.*
4. **Mitigate and correct:** *Replace the sources of lead in building plumbing. Again, EPA 3T's Guidance will be followed.*

5. Lead Paint

OAR 581-022-2223(5)(e) states that the Healthy and Safe Schools Plan must include a plan to reduce exposure to lead paint that includes the following compliance with the United States Environmental Protection Agency's Renovation, Repair and Painting Program Rule.

The Renovation, Repair and Painting Program Rule requires that individuals and firms conducting renovation, repair and painting projects on pre-1978 homes and child-occupied facilities (child care and schools) be certified to follow lead-safe work practices. In order to comply with the United States Environmental Protection Agency's Renovation, Repair and Painting Program Rule, the Coos Bay School District will test suspect paint to determine lead content prior to any remodel, renovation or paint preparation in all pre 1978 and child occupied facilities. The Coos Bay School District will contract with certified contractors.

6. Integrated Pest Management

OAR 581-022-2223(5)(f) states that the Healthy and Safe Schools Plan must include a plan to implement integrated pest management (IPM) practices as required under ORS 634.700 through 634.750.

The district has adopted an integrated pest management plan as required by ORS 634.700 through 634.750. Community members can access a copy of the IPM plan here:

7. Communication

OAR 581-022-2223(5)(g) states that the Healthy and Safe Schools Plan must include a plan to communicate results for all tests required under the Healthy and Safe Schools Plan that includes the following:

- *The Coos Bay School District will make all test results available to the public within five business days of receiving the results.*
- *All results are available on the Coos Bay School District website and may also be sent by email and are available in hard copy.*
- *The Coos Bay School District will provide detailed information explaining test results.*
